Take a pencil outside and sketch the landscape. Keep shadow, perspective and texture in mind whilst sketching.	Calculate the cost of your favourite meal. Visit a local store and find the ingredients and their costs. Explain your findings in the form of a poster.	Record your resting heart rate and complete five different exercises, recording your beats per minute after each one. Present your results in a graph of your choosing.
Write a diary entry for memorable day you have had. Remember to include all the features of a diary and entry and be descriptive.	Research wolves and present your findings in a PowerPoint presentation, a word document or a handwritten fact file.	Autumn is a time of change. Show this in the form of a photograph (or a series of photographs).
Show off your neatest handwriting! Choose an extract from a story or poem and rewrite it in your best, most legible, handwriting.	Pick a maths topic and create your own lesson involving instruction about how to complete the objective and a series of 'Do it', 'Stretch it', 'Solve it' questions.	Use materials you have at home, or can find outside, to create a collage of an animal of your choice.
Research and create a fact file about an Ancient Greek god or goddess.	Create a poster about the Zones of Regulations. Include: a definition, a range of synonyms for the emotions and strategies for returning to the 'Green zone'.	Create a structure out of recyclable materials. Your structure must represent a place you have been to, a fictitious place or a place you have seen in pictures.
